Rev 19:10 – power of testimony

(Ps 78:1, 4-7) <sup>1</sup> Give ear, O my people, to my <u>law</u>; Incline your ears to the words of my mouth. <sup>4</sup>We will not hide them from their children, <u>telling to the generation to come</u> the praises of the LORD, and His strength and His wonderful <u>works</u> that He has done. <sup>5</sup>For He established a <u>testimony</u> in Jacob, and appointed a <u>law</u> in Israel, which He commanded our fathers, that they should <u>make them known to their children</u>; <sup>6</sup>That the generation to come might know them, the children who would be born, that they may arise and <u>declare them to their children</u>, <sup>7</sup>that they may set their hope in God, and not forget the **works** of God, but <u>keep His commandments</u>;

1. Testimony = Word & Works

Tabernacle of Testimony (Ex 38:21), Ark of Testimony (Ex 25:16, 21)
Inside Ark - Two Tablets of Testimony/Ten Commandments (Ex 31:18) Heb 9:4
Before Ark (God) – Manna (Ex 16:33-34\*), Aaron's Rod (Nu 17:10) - works
Before Ark (Moses) – Book of Law (Deut 31:24-26)
Dedication of Solomon's Temple – only Tablets in Ark (1 Ki 8:9)

\* Manna to be kept for Generations

King Joash: Testimony = Book of Law (2 Ki 11:12)

Forgetting the Works is only Keeping Half of the Testimony.

(Isa 8:19-20) <sup>19</sup>And when they say to you, "Seek those who are mediums and wizards, who whisper and mutter," should not a people seek their God? Should they seek the dead on behalf of the living? <sup>20</sup>To the <u>law</u> and to the <u>testimony</u>! If they do not speak according to this word, it is because there is no light in them.

(Mt 22:29) <sup>29</sup>Jesus answered and said to them, "You are mistaken, not knowing the <u>Scriptures</u> nor the <u>power</u> of God.

2. Full Testimony Necessary for Generations to "set their hope in God".

Rules without Power leads to not Keeping Commandments

(Ps 78:9-11) <sup>9</sup>The children of Ephraim, being armed and carrying bows (fully equipped), <u>turned</u> <u>back</u> in the day of battle. <sup>10</sup>They did not keep the covenant of God; They <u>refused to walk in His</u> <u>law</u>, <sup>11</sup>and <u>forgot His works and His wonders</u> that He had shown them.

Word & Works tied together; can't lose one without neglecting the other (generations) (Ps 78:18-22) <sup>18</sup>And they <u>tested God in their heart</u> by asking for the food of their fancy. <sup>19</sup>Yes, they spoke against God: They said, "Can God prepare a table in the wilderness? <sup>20</sup>Behold, He struck the rock, so that the waters gushed out, and the streams overflowed. Can He give bread also? Can He provide meat for His people?" <sup>21</sup>Therefore the LORD heard this and was furious; So a fire was kindled against Jacob, and anger also came up against Israel, <sup>22</sup>because <u>they did not believe in God</u>, and <u>did not trust in His salvation</u>.

Faith Issue: Unbelief in Works Leads to Unbelief of Word (generations)

(Ps 78:41-42) <sup>41</sup>Yes, again and again they tempted God, and <u>limited</u> the Holy One of Israel. <sup>42</sup>They <u>did not remember His power</u>:

Unbelief Limits God's Works

(Mk 6:5-6) <sup>5</sup>Now <u>He could do no mighty work there</u>, except that He laid His hands on a few sick people and healed them. <sup>6</sup>And He marveled because of their <u>unbelief</u>. Then He went about the villages in a circuit, <u>teaching</u>.

They would only accept word, not works.

(Ps 78:56) <sup>56</sup>Yet they tested and provoked the Most High God, and did not keep His testimonies,
