The Gift that Keeps Giving Linda Howard

Central Theme: One of the greatest gift God has given to us is the ability to give.

Call to Worship: This is what real love is: It is not our love for God; it is God's love for us. He sent his Son to die in our place to take away our sins. (I John 4:10).

"Bring to the storehouse a full tenth of what you earn so there will be food in my house. Test me in this," says the Lord All-Powerful. "I will open the windows of heaven for you and pour out all the blessings you need (Malachi 3:10).

Introduction—I love the Old Testament. There is so much there that we don't see. It is like a treasure hunt. Hidden in the genealogies are treasures. The prayer of Jazeb. There is also parabolic language which points to salvation and our Savior. One treasure that I believe is becoming lost is the importance of the Title. **Have member read Malachi 3:10-12.**

- I. The author of the book of Malachi is a mystery. Was this the name of the author or the title of the group of sermons. Malachi means My Messenger or Messenger of God. The time when the book was written is some time after the Jews' return from Babylon and after the temple has been built.
 - A. Through Malachi, God gives his people a stern rebuke. He says, "You have robbed me."
 - B. He says, "You can't prosper because you have taken what is mine."
 - C. Then the Lord declares, "Bring to the storehouse (or the church) a full tenth and I will open the windows of heaven for you.
 - D. I'll take away the pests that destroy, and your vines will have abundant fruit.
 - E. It's a simple principle. 1/10 of everything you earn belongs to God.
- II. This the one time in the scriptures that God says, "Test me."
 - A. Testimony of people who don't tithe, "I can't afford it." FSH—10 apples-1apple=9 apples
 - B. Testimony of people who do tithe, "We can't afford not to tithe."
 - C. FSH picked the worst time in our marriage to begin to tithe but that week we sold our house and got a settlement on a car that was wrecked with our move to Florida.
- III. (Matthew 5:17) The Tithe was well established in the time of Jesus. He said, "I didn't come to destroy the Law and the prophets. I came to fulfill them. So you can be blessed."
 - A. As a child, my parents didn't ever give us money to put in the church. We earned money with jobs and we were told to give 1/10 of whatever we earned.
 - B. The principle that we often miss is that we are giving back to God a small portion—the word tithe means tenth.

- C. The money we earn represents our time, our talents and our value. We are allowed to give a small amount back to the Lord.
- C. In a real way, we are giving of ourselves.
- IV. Yet, the paradox is that everything belongs to the Lord. All things are his. He lends what we have to us (Read the scriptures)
 - A. Thinking that we can keep what God tells us belongs to him is the ultimate insult and conceit.
 - 1. The tenth is no more than a tip. We tip waiters/waitresses, people who carry our luggage, uber drivers. It's a thank you for good service.
 - B. Doesn't God deserve this small thank you for all he has given to us.
 - C. When my grandson was a teenager, he acquired things that belonged to his father.
 - 1. I had to remind my son of the things he didn't realize were important to me that he also acquired.
- V. Perhaps the best gift God has given to us is the ability to give back to him and give to others.
 - A. In a unique way we are able to participate in the creative wonder of the Lord when we give.

Conclusion—The Father wants to pour out blessings to us. The tithe is a test so he can bless us. He wants to do for us what we cannot do for ourselves and that is multiple—pressed down, running over.

Psalm 50:11

Leviticus 27:26
