Story: Healing phone call

(Ga 6:12-15) ¹²As many as desire to make a good showing in the flesh, these would compel you to be circumcised, only that they may not suffer persecution for the cross of Christ. ¹³For not even those who are circumcised keep the law, but they desire to have you circumcised that they may boast in your flesh. ¹⁴But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world. ¹⁵For in Christ Jesus neither circumcision nor uncircumcision avails anything, but a new creation.

Justification: Religious Effort vs Cross

(Ga 5:11) ¹¹And I, brethren, if I still preach circumcision, why do I still suffer persecution? Then the <u>offense of the cross</u> has ceased.

Offense: you add nothing, what you bring needs to die not better life (better flesh), new life (new creation by His Spirit)

(2 Co 5:14-17) ¹⁴For the <u>love of Christ compels us</u>, (context: reconciliation) because we judge thus: that if One died for all, then <u>all died</u>; ¹⁵and He died for all, that those who live should <u>live no longer for themselves</u>, <u>but for Him</u> (Gal 2:20) who died for them and rose again. ¹⁶Therefore, from now on, <u>we regard no one according to the flesh</u>. Even though we have known Christ according to the flesh, yet now we know Him thus no longer. ¹⁷Therefore, if anyone is in Christ, he is a <u>new creation</u>; old things have passed away; behold, <u>all things have become new</u>.

(1Co 1:17-25) ¹⁷For Christ did not send me to baptize, but to <u>preach the gospel</u>, not with wisdom of words, lest the cross of Christ should be made of no effect. ¹⁸For the message of the <u>cross is foolishness</u> to those who are perishing, but to us who are being saved it is the <u>power of God</u>. ¹⁹For it is written: "I will destroy the wisdom of the wise, and bring to nothing the understanding of the prudent." ²⁰Where is the wise? Where is the scribe? Where is the disputer of this age? Has not God made foolish the wisdom of this world? ²¹For since, in the wisdom of God, the world through wisdom did not know God, it pleased God through the foolishness of the message preached to save those who believe. ²²For Jews request a sign, and <u>Greeks seek after wisdom</u>; ²³but we preach Christ crucified, to the Jews a stumbling block and to the Greeks foolishness, ²⁴but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the <u>power of God</u> and the <u>wisdom</u> of God. ²⁵Because the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men.

there is Power in the Message of the Cross

(1Co 2:1-5) ¹And I, brethren, when I came to you, did not come with <u>excellence of speech</u> or of <u>wisdom</u> declaring to you the testimony of God. ²For <u>I determined not to know</u> anything among you except Jesus Christ and Him crucified. ³I was with you in weakness, in fear, and in much trembling. ⁴And my speech and my preaching were <u>not with</u> <u>persuasive words of human wisdom</u>, but in <u>demonstration of the Spirit and of power</u>, ⁵that your <u>faith should not be in the wisdom of men but in the power of God</u>.

we don't need better message or methods we need Demonstration of the Power of the Cross (Phl 3:17-21) ¹⁷Brethren, join in <u>following my example</u>, and note those who so walk, as you have us for a pattern. ¹⁸For many walk, of whom I have told you often, and now tell you even weeping, that they are the <u>enemies of the cross of Christ</u>: ¹⁹whose end is destruction, whose god is their belly, and whose glory is in their shame—who <u>set their mind on earthly things</u>. ²⁰For <u>our citizenship is in heaven</u>, from which we also eagerly wait for the Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ, ²¹who will transform our lowly body that it may be conformed to His glorious body, according to the working by which He is able even to subdue all things to Himself.

we need to follow Paul's mindset - continual focus on the cross Passover - just had to apply the blood to the entry point

(Col 1:19-20) ¹⁹For it pleased the Father that <u>in Him all the fullness should dwell</u>, ²⁰and by Him to <u>reconcile all things to Himself</u>, by Him, whether things on earth or things in heaven, having made peace <u>through the blood of His cross</u>.

What the cross purchased (legal transaction) - access to His Fullness Salvation: Forgiveness (Col 1:14), Justification (Rom 5:9), Righteousness (2 Cor 5:21), Deliverance (Col 1:13), Healing (1 Pe 2:24/Isa 53:5), Everything in His Kingdom

(Col 2:13-16) ¹³And you, being dead in your trespasses and the uncircumcision of your flesh, He has made alive together with Him, having <u>forgiven you all trespasses</u>, ¹⁴having <u>wiped out the handwriting of requirements</u> that was against us, which was contrary to us. And He has taken it out of the way, having <u>nailed</u> it to the <u>cross</u>. ¹⁵Having <u>disarmed principalities</u> and <u>powers</u>, He made a public spectacle of them, triumphing over them in it. ¹⁶So let no one judge you...
